

Trustee Board

The Trustee Board is the corporate leadership body responsible for the overall control of College governance, resources, its assets, all financial matters and risk. It has overall responsibility for the corporate strategy that enables delivery of the profession priorities and policies of Council. Trustees have statutory duties, including personal liability for ensuring RCGP is run in accordance with Charity law. It oversees the work of three trading companies - RCGP Enterprises Ltd, RCGP Conferences Ltd and RCGP International Ltd, each of which has a Board of Directors.

The Chair of the Trustee Board and four of the trustees are elected by Council, three are Council Officers and four are independent trustees appointed for their expertise in leadership and delivery. Trustees are volunteers and are not paid for this role.

Planning and Resources



The Executive Management Team is led by the Chief Executive Officer and has responsibility for the operational management of RCGP delegated to it by the Trustee Board. Their work is scrutinised by the Trustee Board Committees.

They lead College staff who are organised into four Directorates – Membership Development and Education, Planning and Resources, Policy and Engagement, Professional Training and Standards.

Devolved Council

Devolved Councils for Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland have delegated powers from Council to lead work with the Devolved Nation administrations, reflecting and addressing the differences in law and NHS services. Each Council elects a Chair who is an ex-officio member of Council and includes faculty representatives and appointed roles in each devolved nation.
