General Practice Education Award

For distinguished work in the field of Medical Education in General Practice

Aim:

Many students and trainees have been enthused or stretched by an inspirational teacher. The East Scotland Faculty General Practice Education Award recognises GP educationalists including Undergraduate Teachers and those involved in Postgraduate teaching, including Educational Supervisors within GP Specialty Training and those more widely involved in Postgraduate education who have 'gone the extra mile' to deliver high quality personal teaching to young doctors preparing for careers in General Practice.

Award:

The Award will comprise a medal and will be presented at the RCGP East Scotland Faculty Annual Lecture in June. If in any one year there are no suitable applications, the award will be held over to the following year.

Eligibility:

The award is made for distinguished work in the field of medical education. The award is primarily to recognise the work of those involved in face-to-face teaching of undergraduate students such as Undergraduate Tutors, those involved in group teaching or leading General Practice teaching, or those involved in training Trainees or Registrars, such as Educational Supervisors, Associate Advisers, Training Programme Directors, Assistant Directors or Directors of Postgraduate GP Education.

Process:

- **1.** The award is open to Members or Fellows of the College and to non-members in the East Scotland Faculty region.
- 2. Application is by nomination, including self-nomination.
- **3.** Nominations should include details up to 500 words of the distinguished work, motivation and inspiration of the proposed recipient.
- **4.** The nomination must be supported by one or two sponsors, including one individual who has been inspired by the proposed recipient.
- 5. The award will be adjudicated by the East Scotland Faculty Fellowship and Awards Committee. In the interests of openness and transparency, the adjudicators will be judging anonymised award nominations for this award. All personal details will be erased.
- 6. The Committee will make recommendation to the East Scotland Faculty Board.
